Since moving here I’ve maintained a job and sobriety. I will be graduating from Drug Court on September 24, 2007. This is a huge accomplishment because drug court is probably the hardest program offered by the City. The Trinity House has helped me to maintain a good environment for my baby.

I am extremely grateful to The Trinity House because I was able to get the assistance of an attorney pro-bono. This was a huge achievement because I really needed help in receiving child support and in my custody case. If it hadn’t been for The Trinity House, the outcome could have been quite different.
